**Korean Performance Artist Eunsook Lee Stages 3.8 Km.  
Walk for Peace in Berlin between South and North Korean Embassies**

On the occasion of Korea's 70th anniversary of liberation,  
Ms. Eunsook Lee returns to Berlin to stage a street performance titled:

**Korea. Bound as One**  
– *Reunite Families Separated by the DMZ*

Starting Location: South Korean Embassy, Stulerstr. 10, 10787  
Ending Location: North Korean Embassy, Glinkastr. 5-7, 10117

"I was born in South Korea, but I still have brothers and sisters in the North. I want to bind us as one" Said Ms. Lee. Ms. Lee is no stranger to Germany. She lived in Berlin for 3 years, and is best known for her monumental installation "Vanished Berlin Wall," which lighted the Brandenburg Gate in 2007. Prior to that, she created another installation in 2006 on the water in front of Cecilienhof in Potsdam. "Germany's reunification has always given me hope that Korea will also be reunited in my lifetime. This is why I have returned to Berlin. I feel very welcomed here."

This time, Ms. Lee and Berliners will be invited to become the moving installation. She will lay two spools of thread along the walk. "The two threads symbolize North and South Korea. So I will bind them together along the entire course." Berliners will be encouraged to join her as she passes Siegessaule, Brandenburg Tor and the Holocaust Memorial Park.

At the end of the walk, Berliners who participated with Ms. Lee will be invited to cut the threads into pieces as a symbolic way of removing the DMZ. She will also offer a message of peace to end the performance.
